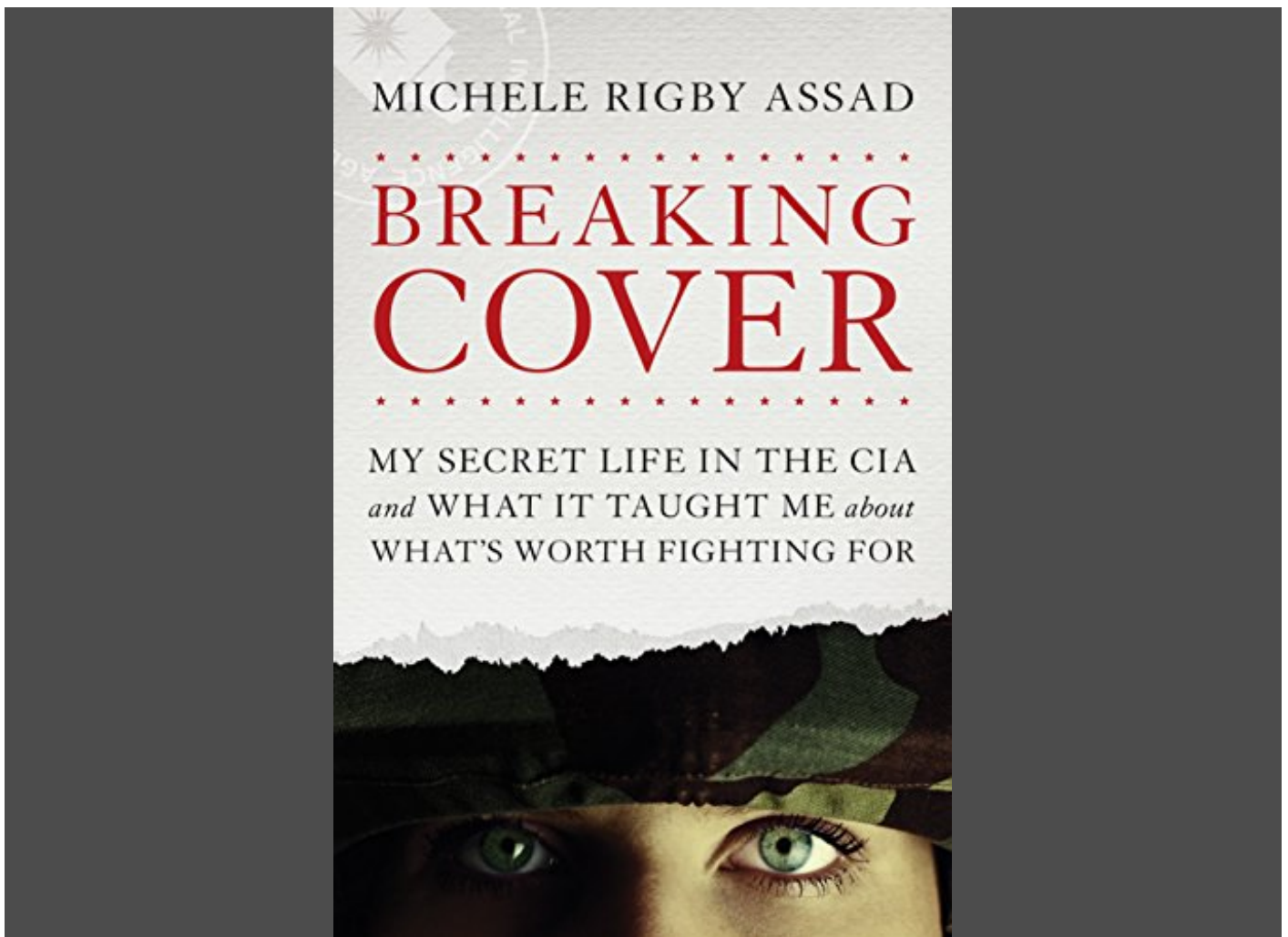


PDF | Breaking Cover: My Secret Life
