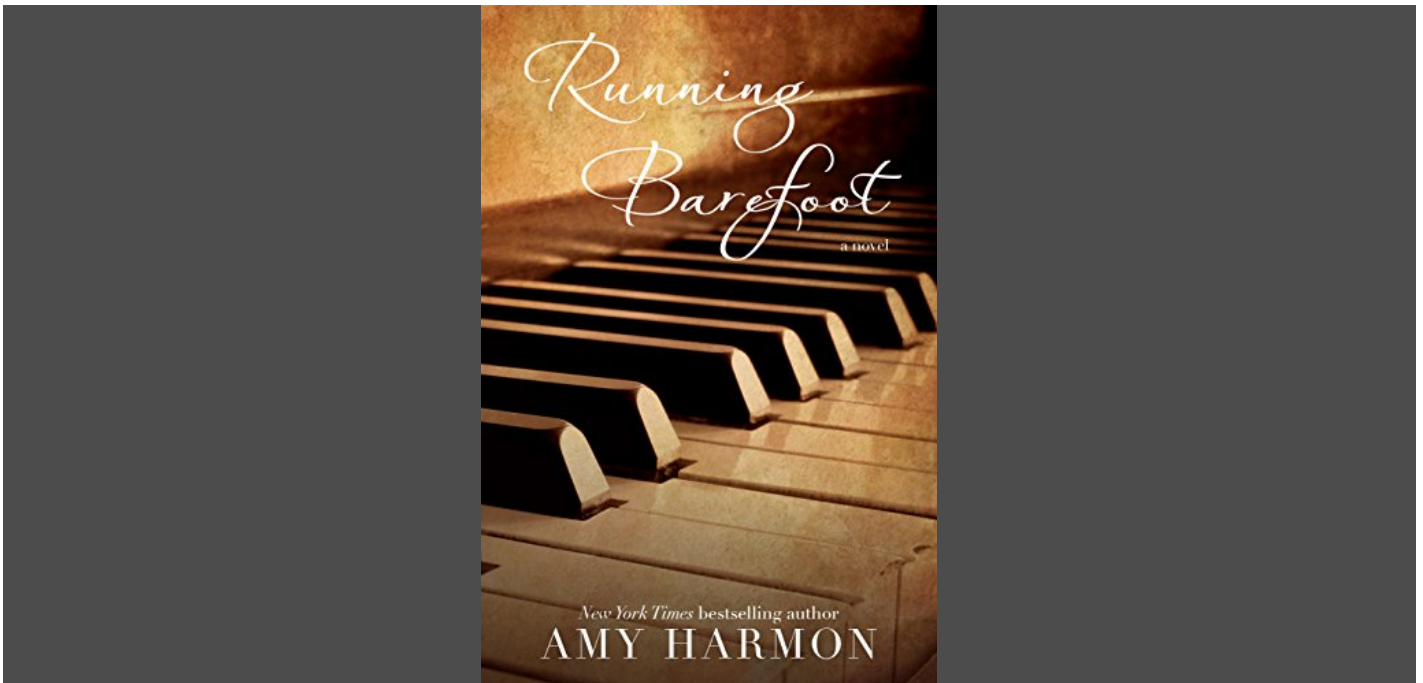


PDF | Running Barefoot
